The purpose of this letter is to give you general information, dates & cost of the 8th Grade Trip - Chicago 2012.

The 8th grade trip - CHICAGO 2012 will be the last week of the school year, Monday, June 11, 2012 thru Thursday, June 14, 2012.

The anticipated cost of the trip is \$620 to \$640.

THE INITIAL DEPOSIT WILL BE DUE ON FRIDAY, OCTOBER 14, 2011 = \$310 TO \$320
THE FINAL DEPOSIT WILL BE DUE ON FRIDAY, FEBRUARY 10, 2012 = \$310 TO \$320
IF THE FINAL TRIP COST IS \$640 DIVIDED BY 360 DAYS = ABOUT \$1.80 PER DAY

We encourage each student to "EARN" the money required for the trip (so kids are invested in the trip), not have mom/dad just write a check. Each family should workout the details for earning money. Some thoughts would be:

- jobs at home/yard work,
- baby-sitting,
- saving gift money,
- other family ideas, like saving gift money or not buying the most expensive items (like basketball shoes etc)
- COLLECTING BOTTLES AND CANS AT MICHIGAN FOOTBALL GAMES WITH YOUR PARENTS

Students are encouraged to start saving for this trip NOW.

We realize that not all families can afford a trip of this cost; therefore, there are partial scholarships available.

THEY ARE DUE BACK TO MS CHABOT BY FRIDAY, MARCH 4, 2011
YOU MUST TURN IN THE SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION BY THE DUE DATE TO BE CONSIDERED FOR A SCHOLARSHIP
ALL SCHOLARSHIPS WILL BE AWARDED BY FRIDAY, MARCH 11, 2011 FOR CHICAGO TRIP 2012

FUNDRAISERS (during 8th grade school year) - There are 3 fundraisers - student do 2 out of the 3

- 1) THE MAGAZINE SALE "COUPON" BOOKLET
 - 2) magazine sale (8 orders)
 - 3) bottle drive - \$20 (you collect bottles/cans) turns in check or cash
- Students are to do TWO of the THREE fundraisers OR DO #3 TWICE (= \$40)
The money goes to the scholarship account.

VOLUNTEERISM (during 8th grade school year) - STARTS TODAY
ALL STUDENTS MUST SPEND TWO HOURS AT A SLAUSON CLEAN UP DAY (usually in the fall)
- students are to volunteer 25 hours: a) family (10 hours),
b) community/neighborhood (10 hours)(church/elementary school/scout project/trash-yard-snow for elderly neighbor), c) Slauson (5 hours) (coaching-cleaning - 5th grade fun night - tutoring).
You can start today = record your hours volunteered on a sheet of notebook paper.
You can flex (do more in one area and none in another) these hours to meet your situation.

Criterion to Participate (during 8th grade school year)

- 1) HONOR LEVEL 3 OR BETTER AND NO MORE THAN 29 DEMERITS PER QUARTER,
- 2) be at school and on time to all classes,
- 3) appropriate behavior at school (classes-halls-cafeteria-activities-assemblies-field trips),
- 4) obligations taken care of (materials turned in / make up time done /from other years)
- 5) turn in on time - trip paperwork - \$ - etc.
